

# How much do you know about New Zealand?

There are 5 sheep per person in New Zealand, making it the highest ratio in the world. With more than 400, New Zealand has more golf courses per capita than anywhere else in the world. The kiwi fruit is not native to New Zealand It's actually from China, but it was named after the kiwi bird. The clearest lake in the world is Nelson's Blue Lake. with a visibility of up to 80 meters deep. Wellington is the southernmost capital in the world. New Zealand became the first country to give women the right to vote in 1893. There are more Scottish piping bands per capita in New Zealand than in Scotland. The Kiwi, which is a little flightless bird native to New Zealand, lays eggs that are about 20% of the mother's body. Kiwi eggs are six times as big as normal for a bird of its size.
